If you are looking for a church to call home, why not consider making this one your own? If this is your first time visiting us, please fill out the visitor information card stapled to your bulletin. All songs are marked with numbers. The red book in the pew has all the songs. Look for the large number in the upper corner of the page to find the correct song.

During the time of **Peace**, you are invited to turn to those around you and offer a word of peace. We suggest a handshake and saying, "Peace be with you." You are also welcomed to offer another gesture of peace (wave, fist-bump, smile, etc.). Hand sanitizer is available in each pew.

At the time of **Offering**, you are invited to share a gift. You may also offer updates to our ongoing prayer list using the yellow cards in the pews and placing them in the offering plates. Visitor information cards and member attendance cards (attached to the front of the bulletin) may also be placed in the offering plates.

At the time of **Holy Communion**, all are welcome to come forward via the center aisle, receive the elements, and return via the side aisles. We begin at the front of the right side, commune all on the right side, then we will invite the left side forward. When you come forward, you may receive the bread from the pastor (gluten free wafers are available), then pre-filled cups with wine or grape juice from the assisting minister. You may consume the elements after receiving them then place the empty cup in the tray held by the acolyte. Those who do not receive Holy Communion are welcome to come forward for a blessing.

If you need a restroom, restrooms are located on the bottom floor at the far side of the building from the elevator. Restrooms may be accessed either via the stairs in the rear of the sanctuary, the stairs by the Greeting Area, or the elevator.

We have wasted the time and the skills that you gave us


and assumed we were powerless to mend the breaches in our world.

Speak tenderly to our anxious hearts.


Tear open the heavens and heal what we have done.


#### LESSON: Exodus 6:2-7a

<sup>2</sup>God also spoke to Moses and said to him: "I am the LORD. <sup>3</sup>I appeared to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob as God Almighty, but by my name 'The LORD' I did not make myself known to them. <sup>4</sup>I also established my covenant with them, to give them the land of Canaan, the land in which they resided as aliens. <sup>5</sup>I have also heard the groaning of the Israelites whom the Egyptians are holding as slaves, and I have remembered my covenant. <sup>6</sup>Say therefore to the Israelites, 'I am the LORD, and I will free you from the burdens of the Egyptians and deliver you from slavery to them. #### LESSON: Isaiah 11:1-10

<sup>1</sup>A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots.

<sup>2</sup>The spirit of the LORD shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD.

<sup>3</sup>His delight shall be in the fear of the LORD. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide by what his ears hear; <sup>4</sup>but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked.

<sup>5</sup>Righteousness shall be the belt around his waist, and faithfulness the belt around his loins.

<sup>6</sup>The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them.



<sup>76</sup>And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the Lord to prepare his ways,


<sup>77</sup>to give knowledge of salvation to his people by the forgiveness of their sins.

and the thirsty ground springs of water;


the haunt of jackals shall become a swamp,


O Emmanuel, our king and our lawgiver, the anointed of the nations and their Savior: Come and save us, Lord our God. Amen.



## Notes for the day's texts:

The O Antiphons use traditional messianic titles for Jesus particularly appropriate to Advent expectation: Wisdom, Adonai, Root of Jesse, Key of David, Dayspring, King of Nations, and Emmanuel. These titles are drawn from Isaiah and were developed by the medieval European church to be used as the Magnificat antiphon in the final seven vespers services leading to Christmas Eve. For centuries, they have inspired art, music, and prayer, including the familiar hymn "O come, O come, Emmanuel" (ELW 257).

The language and imagery of the O Antiphons are drawn from the Hebrew Bible, our Old Testament, which Christians share with the Jewish community. While modern Christians look to these ancient texts to enrich our understanding of the Christ for whom we wait, it is appropriate to approach these antiphons with awareness of the context in which they emerged. The antiphons originated in a historical period when Christian supersessionist readings of scripture were common. As heirs of this history, let us be mindful of the integrity of God's promise given to our Jewish siblings in faith while we pray and sing the O Antiphons.
