# Mission Statement

St. John is a living witness to the **love of God** as shown in Jesus Christ.

We gather faithfully in God's name to worship and praise God; and we go forth in peace to share the Good News and to serve the world around us. How many questions do you ask in a day? Curiosity is a strong force. It drives learning. It fuels exploration and innovation. It leads to discovery and growth. Throughout scripture, there are hundreds and hundreds of questions: questions as people struggle to make sense of their situation, questions as people wonder about God's magnificence, questions about enigmatic stories of faith and how they apply to daily life. Sometimes it can feel isolating to ask questions of our faith, as if the questions are a sign that our faith isn't as strong as we'd like it to be. But what if questions are actually an essential part of our faith journeys? Rabbi Abraham Joshua Heschel once said, "We are closer to God when we are asking questions than when we think we have the answers." In our first confirmation class, we were reminded of the powerful faith practice of asking questions. In response to this reminder, we invited people in worship to offer their questions. Where is curiosity present in your faith? What would you like to learn more about? What topics do you struggle with in your faith? Where does faith provoke questions in your daily life?

To encourage ourselves to practice asking questions, we will be collecting the questions of the congregations for the first few weeks of November. There will be a box available in the Greeting Area for you to submit your questions. We hope to use these questions to help guide worship and Bible study in the beginning of 2025.

To be fair, not every question can be answered. Sometimes we must rely on faith and trust. Sometimes the mystery of God is deeper and bigger than our human minds can comprehend. But even when we can't know the "right" answer, the questions can help us explore our faith, deepen our faith, be in an interactive and engaging relationship with God. So ask the questions. Let your curiosity be a strong force in your faith. You never know where a question will lead you or the community in which you ask the question.

## All Saints Worship – November 3

Commemorating the saints of the church has been a practice since the 4<sup>th</sup> century. In the 8<sup>th</sup> century, the festival commemorating all saints was set on November 1<sup>st</sup>. Protestant churches (including Lutherans) believe that all Christian dead are saints, and there is no need for release from purgatory. In our bulletin on November 3, we will be remembering all of our loved ones who have died. As we remember them, we recall the witness they gave through their lives, what they meant to us as fellow Christians, where they have led the way, and what they have left for us yet to accomplish.

#### Serving on the Boards

St. John is run by three boards, the Deacons, the Elders, and the Trustees. We also have a Mission Endowment Fund Committee and a Mutual Ministry Committee. Each December we elect individuals to serve on each of the boards and the Mission Endowment Committee (the Mutual Ministry Committee is filled by appointment). We are always in need of new people willing to serve. Each term is 2 years long and individuals are welcome to serve for 1 or 2 terms. Though there is often some overlap, each board has its primary areas of responsibility. The Deacons are largely responsible for visiting the homebound, overseeing stewardship practices and events, and planning fellowship opportunities. The Elders are largely responsible for Christian education and faith formation, evangelism, and worship life within the congregation. The Trustees are primarily responsible for taking care of the physical property of the church and overseeing the finances and budget. The Mission Endowment Committee listens to the community and disburses funds collected as interest on an account set aside for mission support. #### **Glimpses of Grace**

#### Sunday Morning Learning and Fellowship

All adults are welcome to join us during the Faith Formation hour (Sundays, 10:15 am-11:15 am) to discuss the scripture read during worship and how it applies to our daily lives. Questions to guide and prompt discussion will be available as well as time to bring your own questions. Grab a cup of coffee and join us in the basement.

Our younger students are invited to participate in our all ages together Sunday School Class. All our younger classes begin Sunday School together, learning a song and about the theme of the day. Once students begin confirmation classes, they are invited to participate in the middle and high school class after learning the song with the rest of the Sunday School.



## Confirmation Classes - One Saturday per month (9:30-11:30am)

Confirmation is a faith formation opportunity that helps our young people (typically grades 6-8) engage with their faith and prepare to take ownership of the promises made on their behalf at baptism. Our first meeting was in October and the students explored the Reformation and how Martin Luther's studies and writings influence how we approach faith and worship.

## Messy Church – Third Fridays (5:30-7:30pm)

We had so much fun at our first Messy Church in October! We cannot wait until the next one! Messy Church is an intentionally intergenerational place for people to meet and experience fun and messy ways to engage in faith, including crafts and activities, celebration, and a shared meal no matter their connection to church. At Messy Church, we celebrate the creative, joyful God revealed in Jesus Christ. Faith formation topics and Bible stories are explored in ways that invite our whole messy selves into God's story of the good news of Jesus Christ - that we are

freed and forgiven in God's abundant grace and that God's love is for us, all of us. **If you would like to help with this ministry, contact Pastor Katie.** No registration is required for this free faith formation opportunity. ## Adult Bible Study

Starting October 16th and 20th, we will be diving into some of the parables Jesus told in our weekly Bible study gatherings on Wednesdays (7:00 pm) and Sundays (6:30 pm). Parables are deeply rooted in their context yet still offer timeless truths about God and what it means to be a follower of Christ. These short stories sometimes seem quite straightforward yet have a complexity to explore under the surface. Other times, the parables are hard to understand or even challenging to hear, and it takes a deeper dive to find the good news of Jesus Christ in them. All are welcome to come and bring your curiosity as we explore together what we can hear in the parables Jesus told. Each session can serve as a standalone session.

# An Advent Activity

#### Attention glue gun slingers and craft store fanatics, have I got a project for you!



Go find five tealight candles, five mason jars, a small box, some blue or purple paint, glue, and something to use as a base (think of the cardboard base of a frozen pizza).

Then paint four of the mason jars blue (or three purple and one pink), glue them onto the base, and put tea lights inside the jars. Then set the box in the center and put the Advent Centerpiece Wreath you've just made in a place of gathering in your home or a place you regularly spend time (i.e., a dining table). Next to the Advent Centerpiece, place a stack of small papers and a pen to

be used throughout the coming Advent season.

As many times as you'd like throughout the week, do as follows:

- Between December 1<sup>st</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> light one tealight, and consider the following question: "What has made me hopeful about the future this week?" Write down or draw what you all come up with and put it into the box. As you put your paper in the box, pray for God to continue to offer you hope in your life.
- Between **December 8<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup>** light two tealights, and consider the following question: "Where have I found **peace** this week?" Write down or draw what you all come up with and put it into the box. As you put your paper in the box, pray for God to continue to offer you peace in your life.
- Between December 15<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> light three tealights, and consider the following question: "What has given me joy this week?" Write down or draw what you all come up with and put it into the box. As you put your paper in the box, pray for God to continue to offer you joy in your life.
- Between December 22<sup>nd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> light all four tealights, and consider the following question: "Where have I found love?" Write down or draw what you all come up with and put it into the box. As you put your paper in the box, pray for God to continue to offer you love in your life.
- Then, on Christmas morning or any of the 12 days of Christmas before Epiphany on January 6<sup>th</sup>, remove the box, replace it with the 5<sup>th</sup> mason jar and tea light. Light all five of the candles and read through all the hope, peace, joy, and love accrued over the season of Advent! All a blessing come to full fruition in Christmas!
