Advent is an odd season. We are simultaneously waiting and paring for the coming of Christ as an infant (which has already

preparing for the coming of Christ as an infant (which has already happened), and we are waiting for Christ to come again to fulfill all things (which has not yet happened). Advent leans deeply into Luther's concept of God's "now and not yet." Christ is with us now. And Christ is going to come (again).

And in preparing for this already and not yet, the now and not yet of Christ's presence among us, we often get tied up in all the logistical planning of the season. Do we have the supplies we need? Are we ready for the gatherings and worship services that will happen? Do we have it all under control? But Advent is more about preparing ourselves to be disrupted and surprised. Our first Sunday in Advent has Jesus telling us that we do not know when he will come again. Christ's coming will come as a surprise to us. It will interrupt and disrupt the world. Christ's arrival disrupts injustice, sin, and brokenness in a society in which we are deeply embedded. We do not always appreciate the ways that God breaks into our lives and disrupts the world around us.

But Christ has already done that. God's love was born among us. The Word incarnate came to this earth and disrupted everything in the person Jesus Christ.

Advent is all about coming to terms with the way that Christ's presence in this world is already disrupting and breaking into our lives... and preparing for the way the Christ will come again and disrupt and break into our lives anew. God is now and not yet among God's people. This Advent, as we pray for Christ to come to us, as he has, as he is, and as he will, is a prayer asking for Christ to interrupt our lives, to disrupt patterns of injustice, sin, and brokenness, and to bring us back to God's love and grace for ourselves, for our neighbors, and for the whole world. So this Advent, as we prepare for this already, now, and not yet, may we welcome God's presence in our lives, no matter how surprising it might be.

# Did You Know?

Advent used to be associated with purple because it was connected to royalty as the church awaits the newborn king (Roman Catholics currently use purple for this reason and associate the solemnity and penance of purple with Advent.). But many years ago, Advent became associated with blue because blue relates to a sense of hope. This association began in Scandinavia, probably because purple dye was too expensive for many churches. The ELCA later adopted blue as the color of Advent, in 1978.

#### **The Advent Wreath**

From our liturgical resources, Sundays and Seasons: "One of the best-known customs for the season is the Advent wreath. The wreath and winter candle-lighting in the midst of growing darkness strengthen some of the Advent images found in the Bible. The unbroken circle of greens is clearly an image of everlasting life, a victory wreath, the crown of Christ, or the wheel of time itself. Christians use the wreath as a sign that Christ reaches into our time to lead us to everlasting life. The four candles mark the progress of the four weeks of Advent. Sometimes the wreath is embellished with natural dried flowers or fruit. Its evergreen branches lead to the evergreen Christmas tree."
