Typically the second Sunday in September, **"this day is an opportunity to celebrate who we are as the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America – one church, freed in Christ to serve and love our neighbor.** Service activities offer an opportunity for us to explore one of our most basic convictions as Lutherans: that all of life in Jesus Christ – every act of service, in every daily calling, in every corner of life – flows freely from a living, daring confidence in God's grace,"

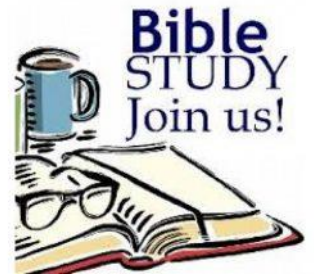

Sunday School News

Dear Parents,

As we conclude our respective “summers”, we now look forward to the start of another Sunday School year. I would like to begin this letter by providing some highlights from last year.

- We consistently held three (3) separate classes each Sunday broken down into Preschool – 1st Grade, 2nd – 5th Grade, and 6th and up. This is in stark contrast to the Sunday’s just a few short years ago when it might have been one of the Cardinal’s.....or (2) of the Niklewicz’s. To regularly have 8, 10, 14 (!) kids is amazing!
- We continue to find success in our rotation schedule mimicking a VBS style schedule with Music, Lesson, Craft, and Snack.
- We started the year with our tithing emphasis focused on the repair of the front retaining wall and sidewalk with a lofty goal of raising \$300. I am happy to report the children (and their families) supported this effort by collecting in excess of \$470!
- The children continue to learn key Bible Versus and are excited to recite them upon learning so they can earn their “Stars”. In fairness, will these verses stick with them months later? Probably not, but the point in the effort is to gain familiarity and confidence in reading and learning God’s Word. To that end, I say Mission Accomplished!



So what lies ahead of us in the 2022 / 2023 school year? Well, much of the same!

- We will continue to support three (3) classes broken out by the same grade ranges with Missy Kramer leading the littlest learners, myself taking the middle age group, and Ruth Ann Tully leading the older students. Although our Whirl Lectionary Curriculum seems to speak well to the middle age group, Pastor Katie provided Missy a few ideas to help better engage the younger crew. As for Ruth Ann, we recently discussed three (3) paths forward for her class with the Children being the deciding vote on what works for them.
- Meanwhile, Mazie, Matt C. and Denise H. will support the music program with the intent of practicing a simple song during the course of a month. The kids will then LEAD the Congregation on the last Sunday of that month by singing the song during the Children’s Sermon which would be followed by a 2nd run-through of the song by the entire congregation. Basically, exactly what we did last year but with an even greater emphasis on the kid’s leading. What better way to get our Children engaged in Worship by giving them the opportunity to “teach” the Grown-ups!?
- Erin W. will continue to support snack and our bulletin boards. I encourage you to PLEASE check out the craftsmanship Erin puts into the bulletin boards. Erin has a creative gift that we are blessed to have shared with us!
- We also have Denise H., Katie N., and Martha Ward managing crafts. These ladies work wonders with the kids during this time and some of the crafts are still present in the Cardinal household YEARS later!
- And finally, I would certainly be remiss without mentioning the quiet dedication of others like Cindy Knauff, Todd Niklewicz, and Jamie Weaver! These folks help grease the wheels of the program and provide support wherever and whenever needed.

As usual, we do have a few “needs” that I am formally presenting to all St. John Congregants! These needs include:

- Simple Dollar Store / Dollar General / 5 Below Items. These items are placed in the Sunday School Shop for the kids to frequent the same Sunday the Children’s Choir teaches us a song. The kids love “shopping,” and we could always use donations! Feel free to shop yourself and bring the items to the Church or simply donate directly to myself (or let’s be honest my wife Valerie...), Denise Hager, or Katie Niklewicz (make sure you fill out a tithing sheet located outside the church office!) We will need both Boys and Girls items since we have a nice mix of both in our school.
- Beginners Bibles are needed for a few of the younger kids that joined our school recently. In this case, the simplest way to donate would be in the general offering with a note on the envelope indicating “Sunday School Bibles”. The expense is not great – we only need roughly a half dozen at a cost of \$22.99 ea. We already have an account through Augsburg and our Church Secretary can place a bulk order very easily.
- Our tithing emphasis this year will be AlwaysBsmiling.org. We plan on having representatives of the organization meet with us on Sunday October 2nd, so please join us to learn more about this fantastic organization.

One final note.....I believe we are all truly blessed that Pastor Katie joined us recently. Our kids LOVE her in how she engages them....speaks at their level....and talks TO them. This is a gift that not all Pastor’s have, but Pastor Katie simply crushes it! St. John – we are extremely fortunate to have such a wonderfully engaging Pastor and I wanted to take this brief moment to thank her for what she brings to our Congregation and to our kids!

The men and women who help support the Sunday School program do an amazing job. They give freely of their talent, time, and treasure and I thank each and every one of them! I encourage you, my fellow Sisters and Brothers in Christ, to reach out to anyone of the individuals named above with a heartfelt “Thank you” this next Sunday!

The Back to School Transition

Back to school is an exciting time for a lot of kids, but it can also come with lots of challenges. However your child and family feel about transitioning from summer to the routine of school, it's important to recognize the impact this transition can have. **Living Lutheran recently published an article about navigating this yearly transition.** In it, the writer calls us to remember the famous verses in the book of Ecclesiastes: "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven ... a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted" (3:1-2). We have had our summer time, and now it is time for fall and the school schedule. But the end of summer is not the end of leisure and calm. The author writes, "One way to lessen the rocky road of transitioning into a school year is to recommit to sabbath time for your family. **If the school year feels like a rat race, perhaps the sabbath can be your saving grace.** As we head into the busyness of the school year, let's resolve not to lose the sabbath." Hooper (the author of the article) then encourages several practices to help in this endeavor: "**Discuss as a family your goals and expectations for sabbath days during the school year.** Find mutually agreeable ways to honor the sabbath that provide for rest and unscheduled time. **Find time at meals or in the car to discuss the impending transition and all it entails.** Allow for lamentation and excitement over the changes. Verbalizing it will help children prepare for the change. **Create a family calendar that allows input from everyone.** Make it visible to the whole family and take a temperature check on how others feel about the balance between scheduled versus rest time."
